

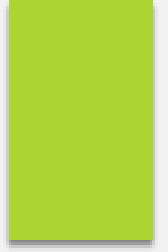

Definition

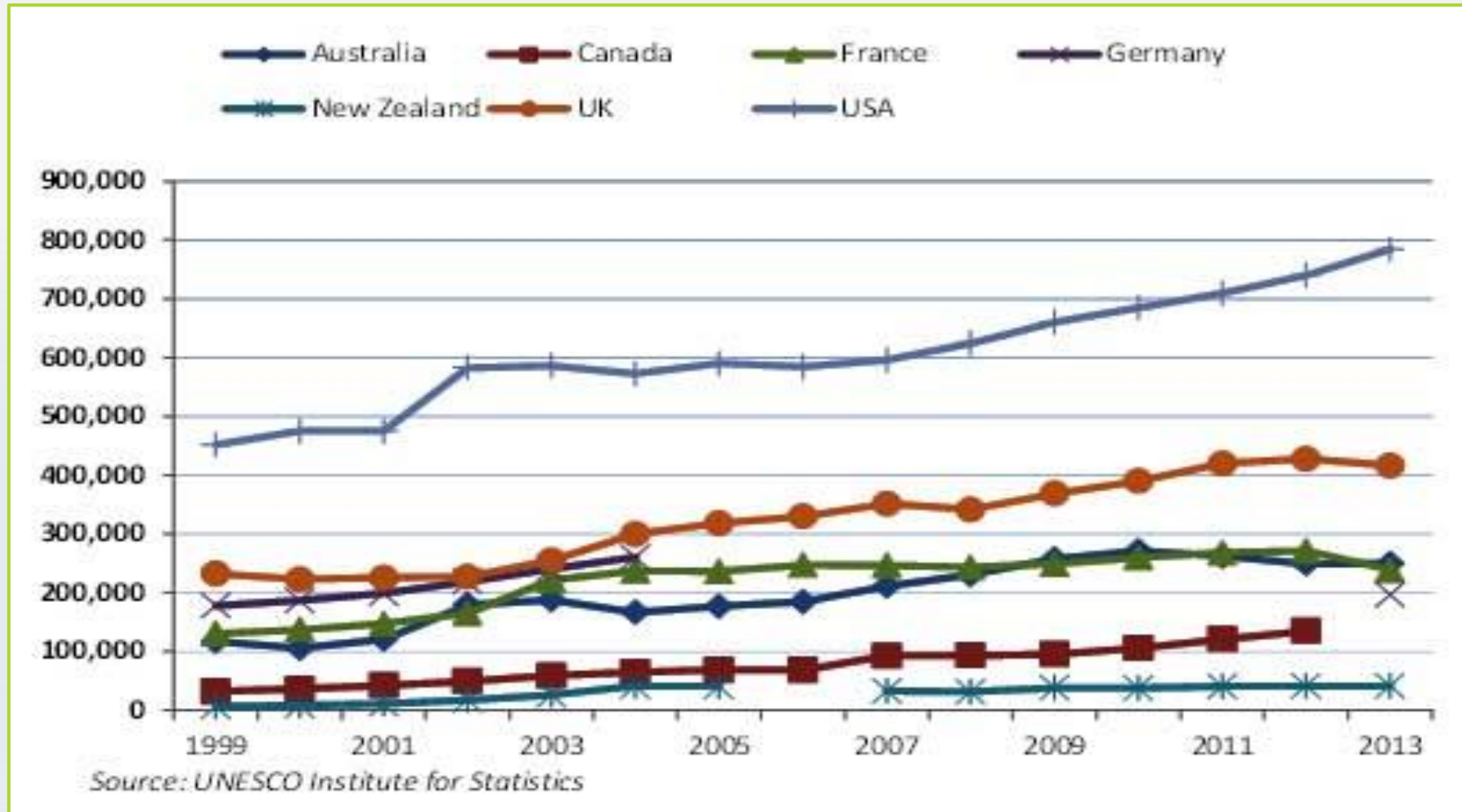
In Canada, defined as “those who left their country of origin and moved to Canada for the purpose of study.”

Benefits of having international students

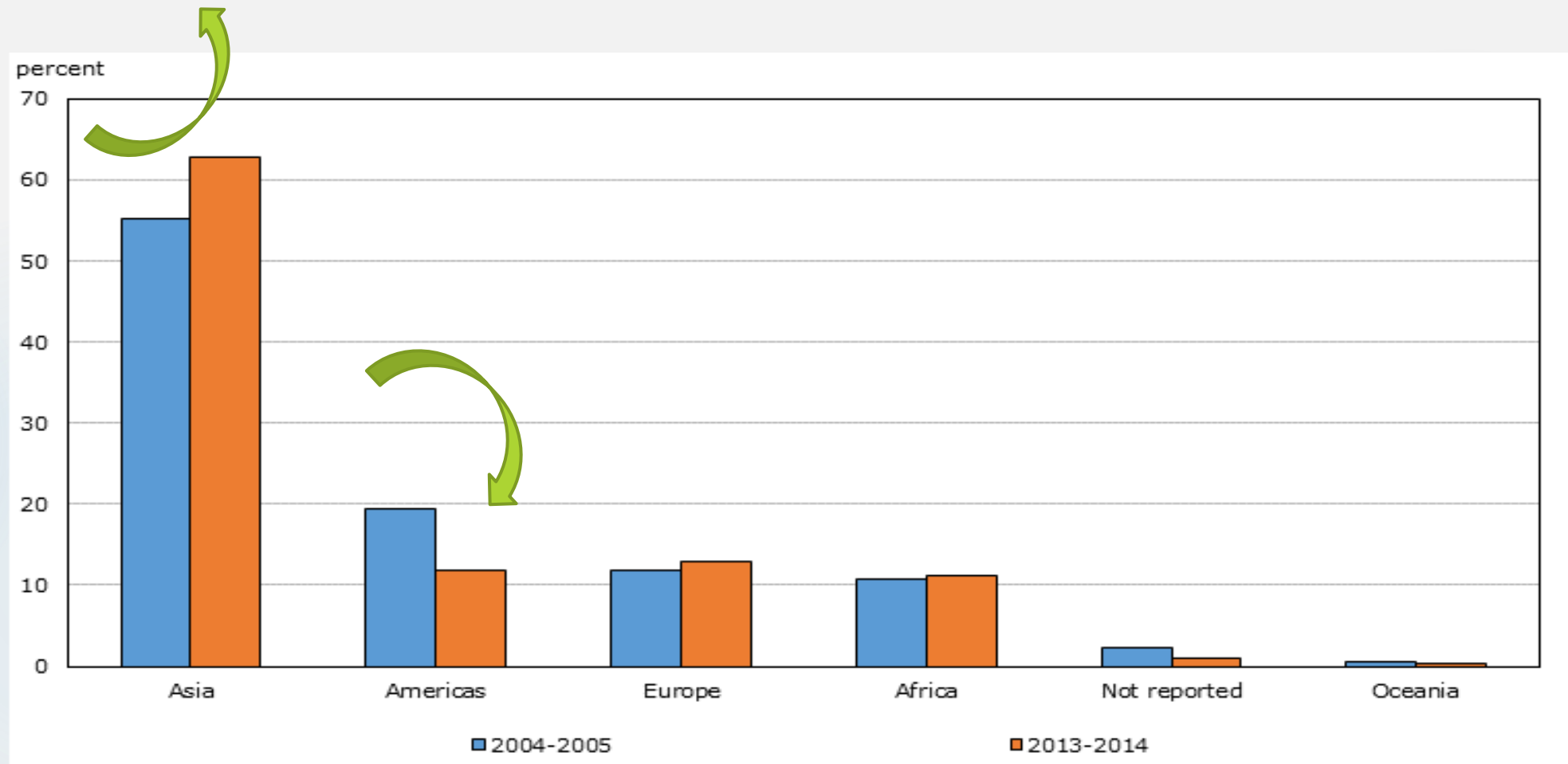
- ▶ Economy of the host countries

Top destination countries of international students worldwide



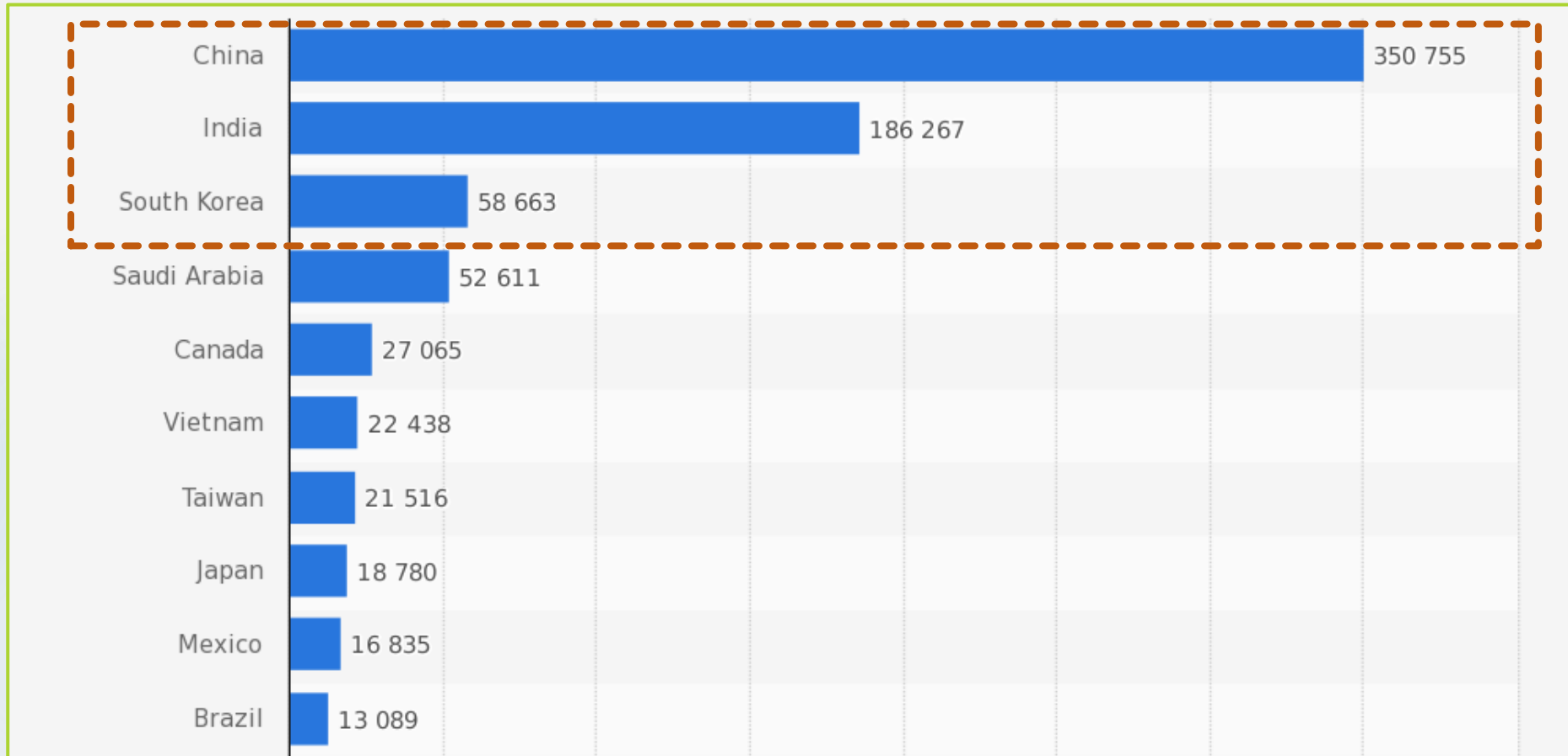

Source regions of international students studying in Canada



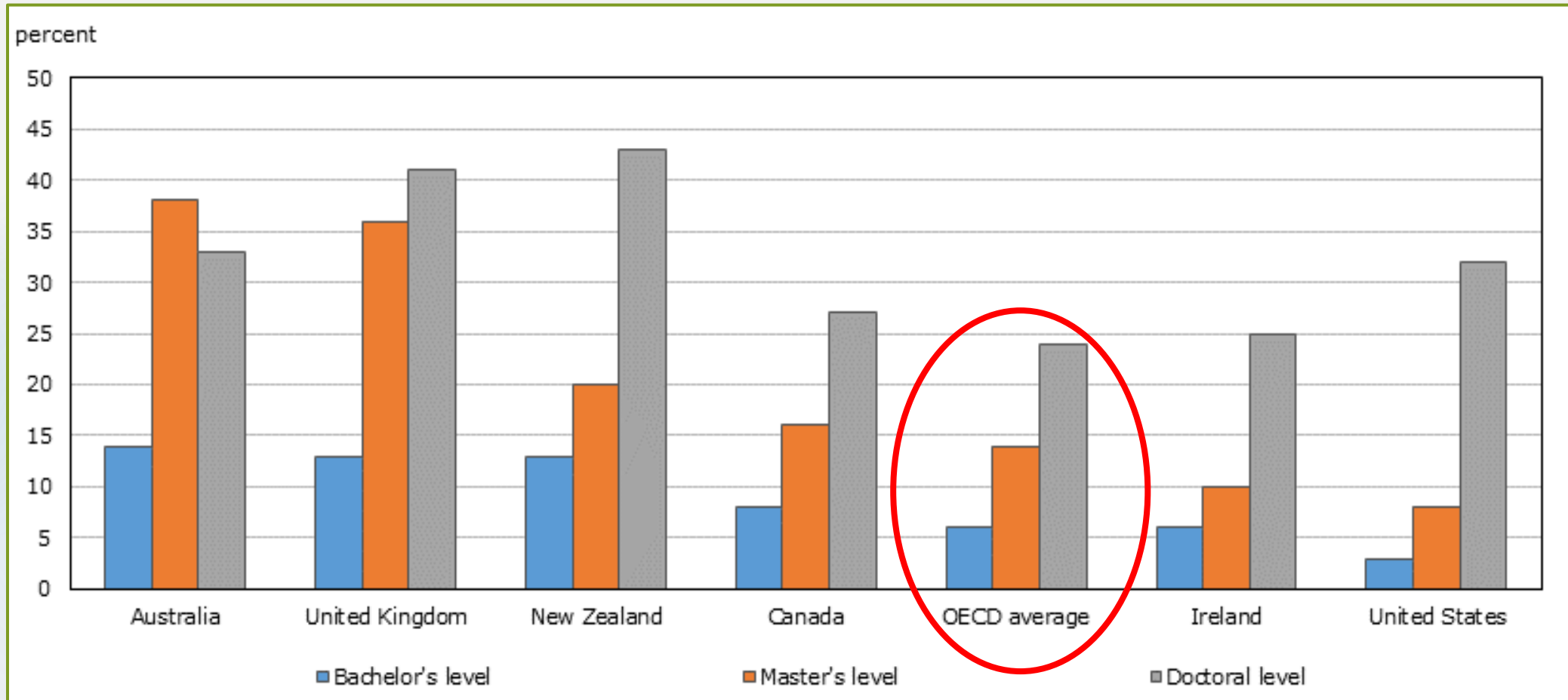

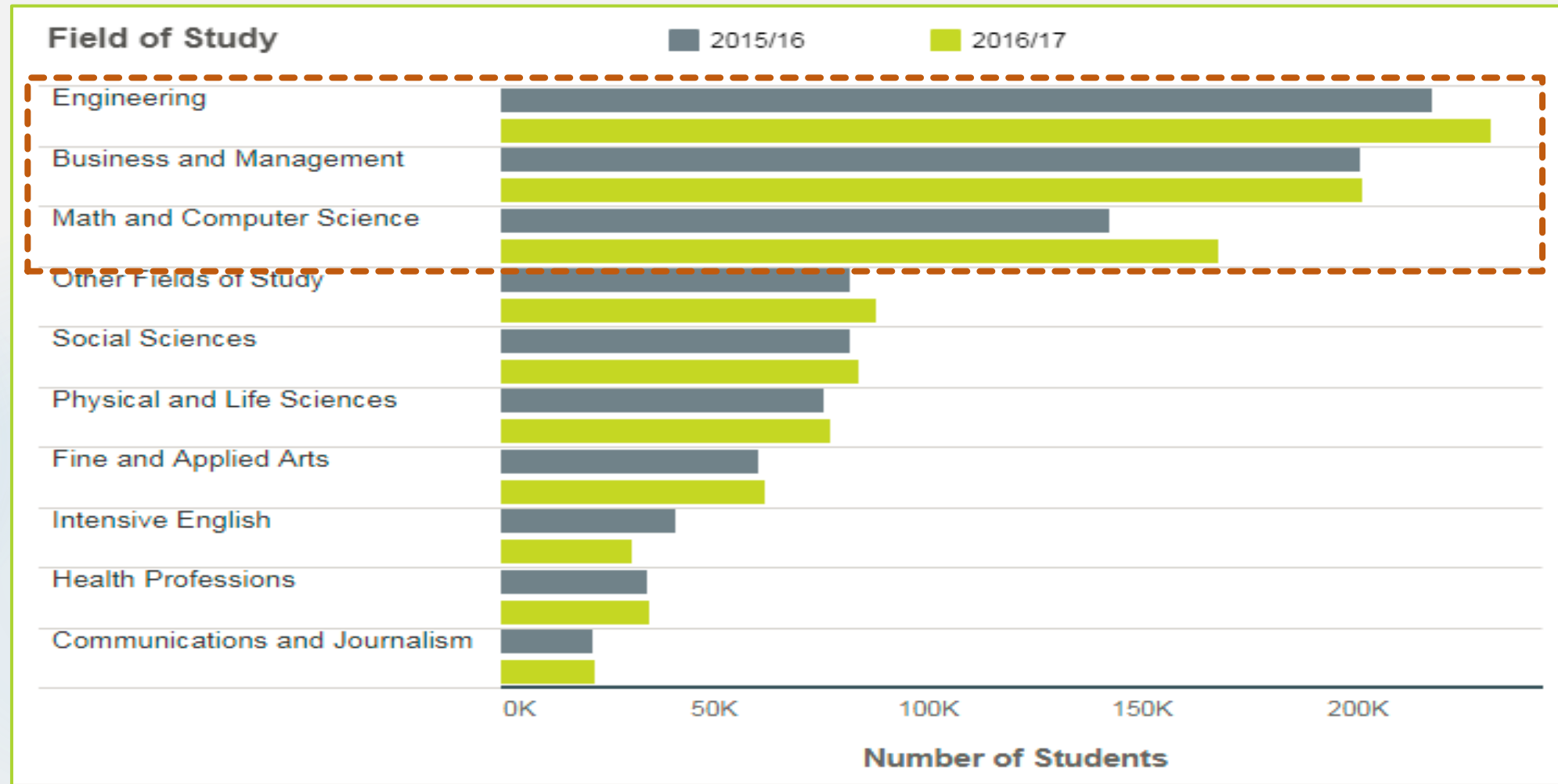
Proportion of international students, by program level, selected OECD countries

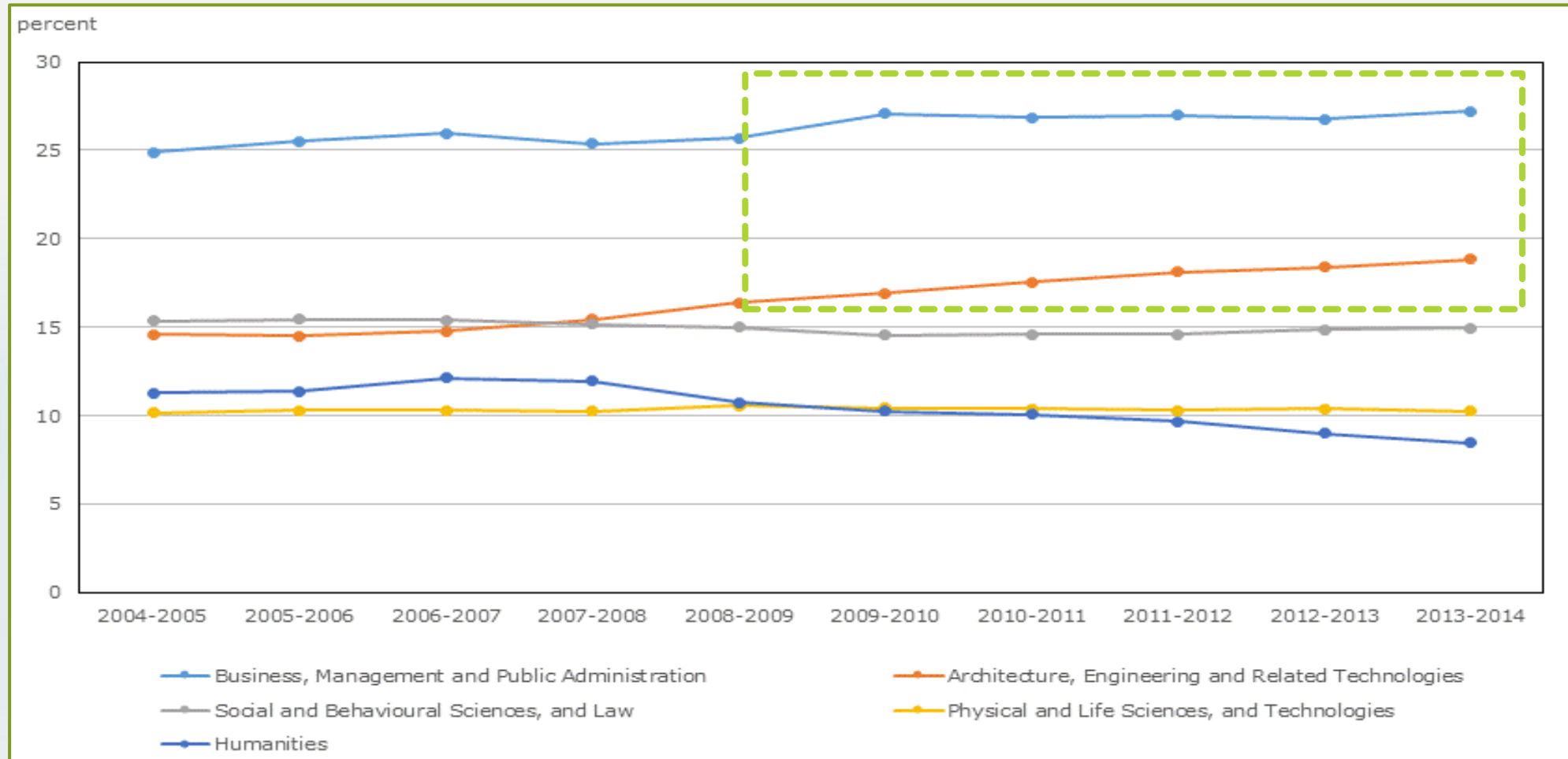

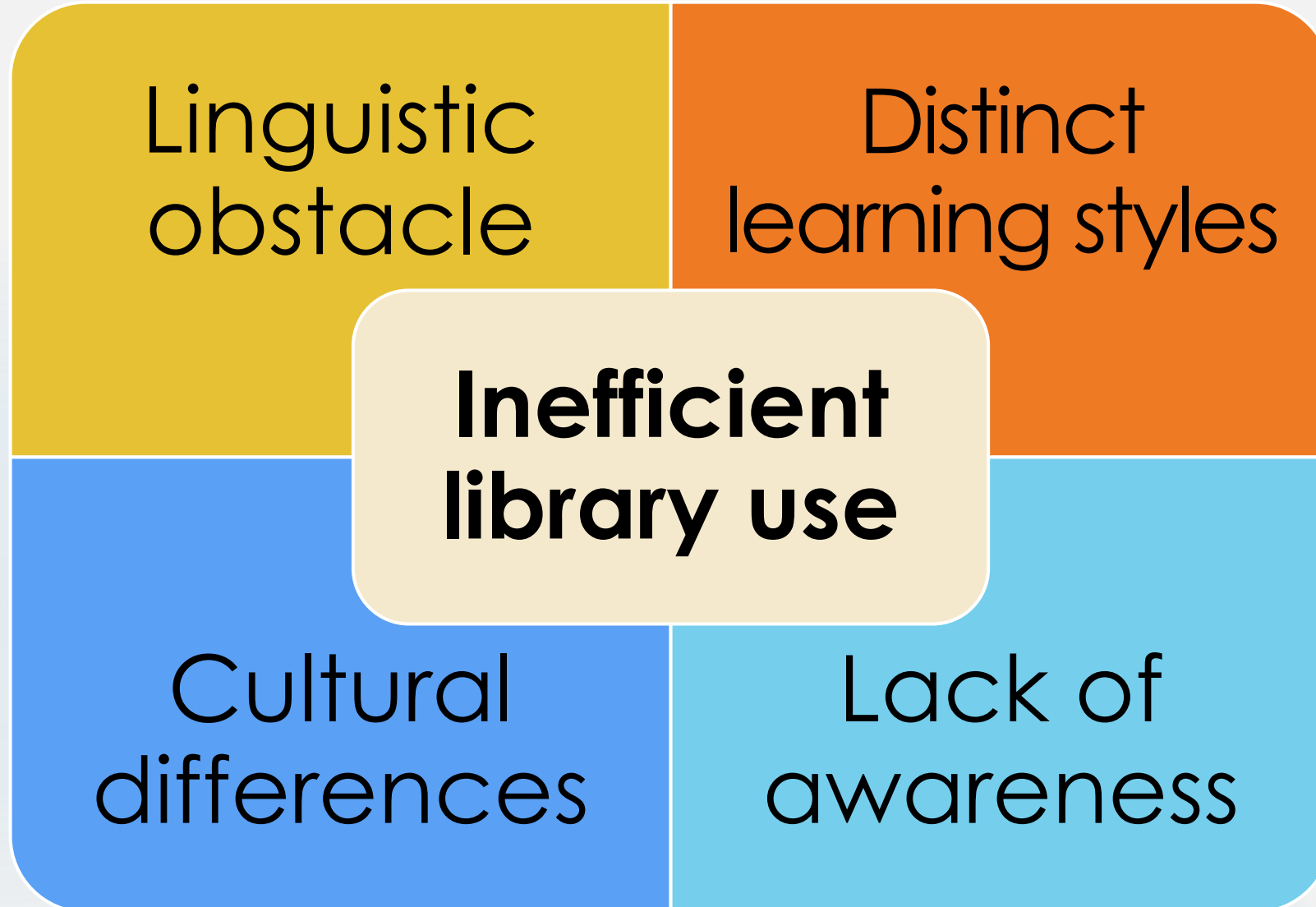
Top five fields of study for international students, Canada

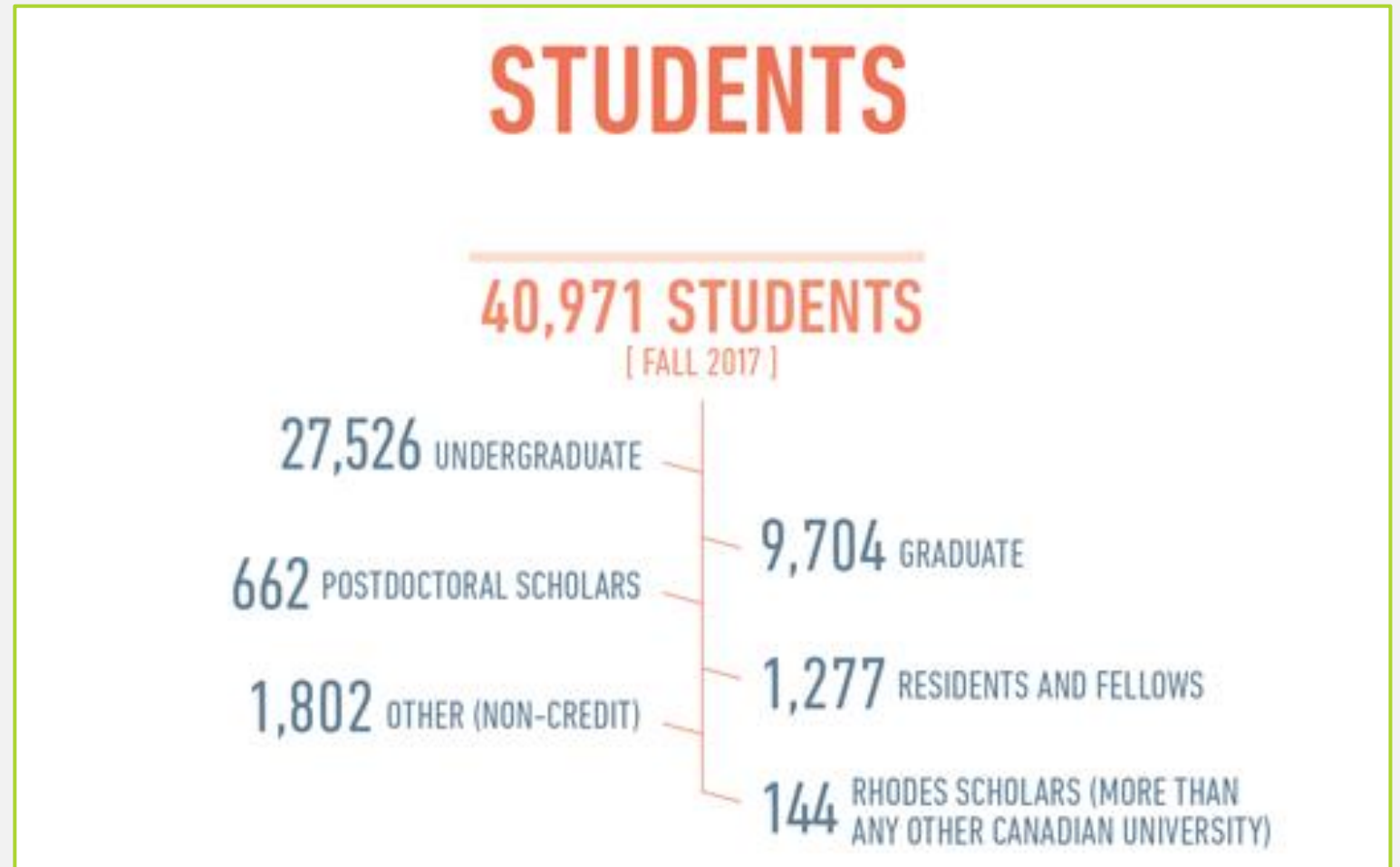

Enrolment data of McGill University

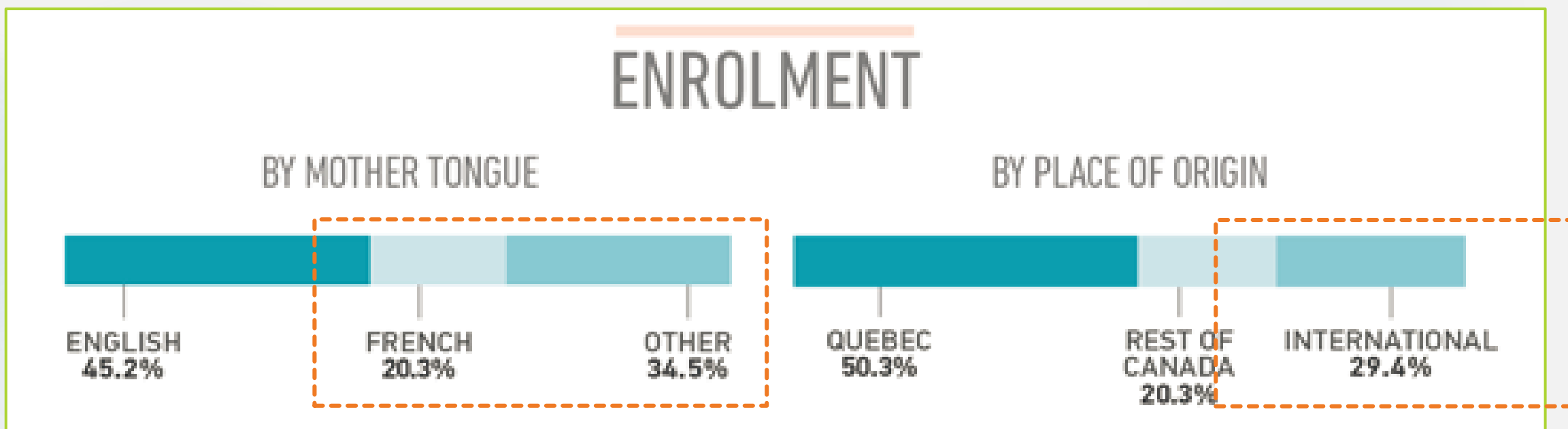

Enrolment by mother tongue and by place of origin

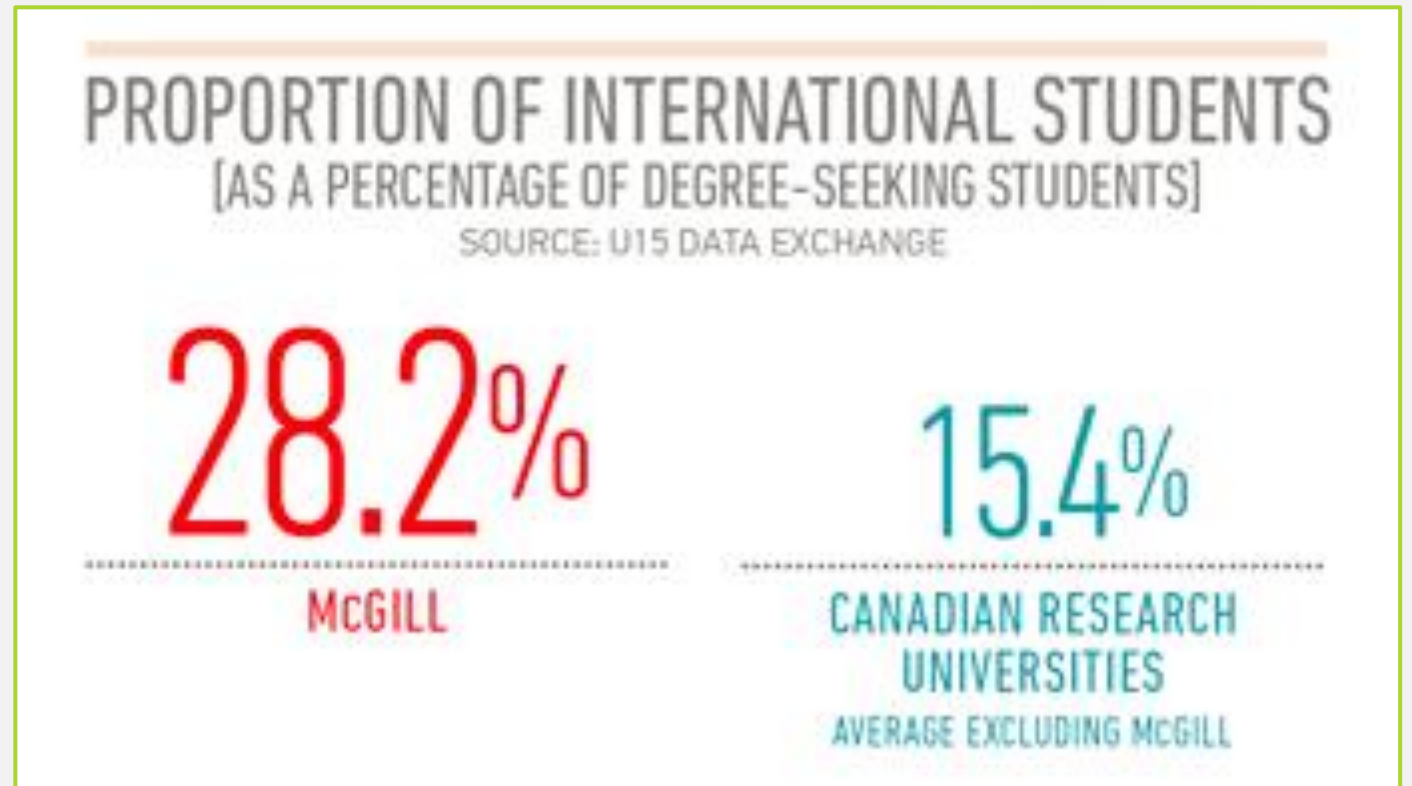

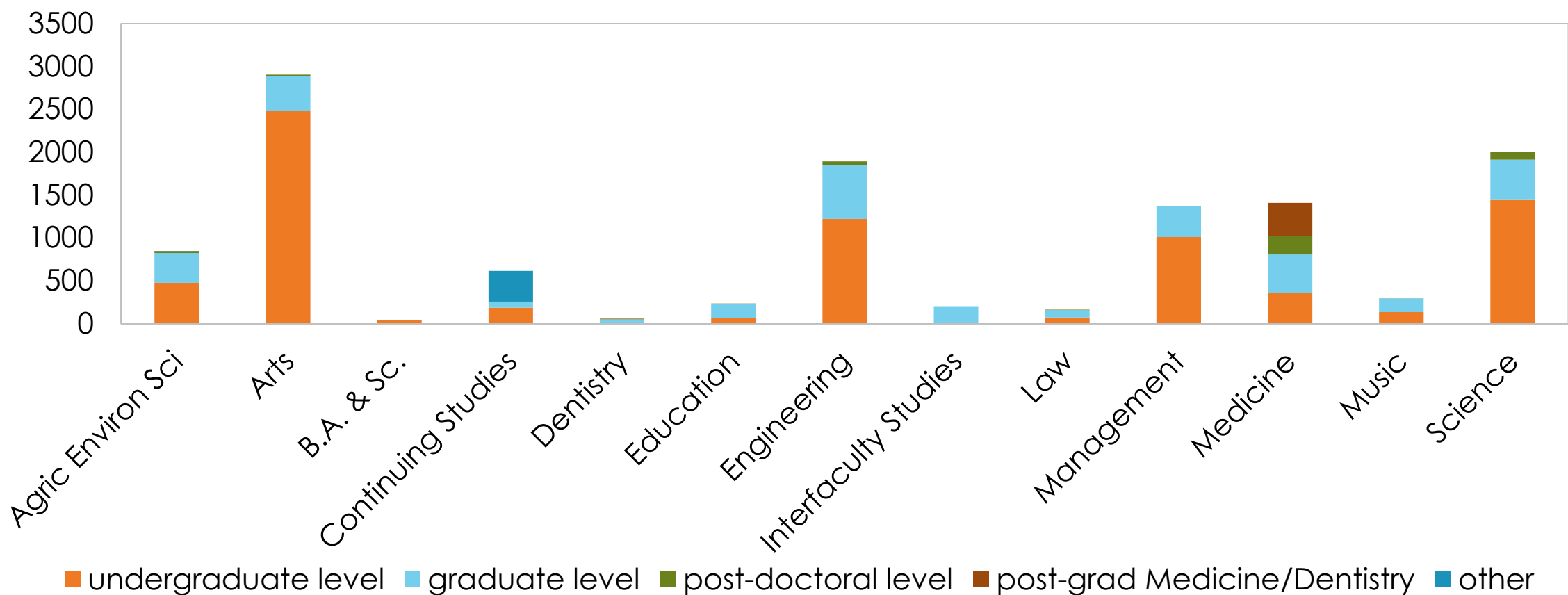

Successful library practices targeting at international students

Outreach

Reception
Peer support
Liaison Librarian
Collaboration with other units (writing centers, etc.)

Scenario

You are invited to give a 1.5-hour guest lecture on using library resources for literature review in an engineering graduate course. There are 25 students in the class and most are in their first year. According to the instructor, between $\frac{1}{3}$ and $\frac{1}{2}$ students may be international students.

► Question?

What strategies will you use to prepare for, deliver, follow up, and assess this session?

Strategies suggested

- ▶ Recognize that **different backgrounds** influence how international students use the library
 - Establish **rapport** with students
- ▶ Use the **simple language** (i.e. vocabulary, sentence, grammar)
 - Develop the ability to explain a concept in multiple ways
 - Adopt inclusive examples
 - Avoid difficult moments using technologies
- ▶ **Avoid cognitive overload** and connect to students' prior knowledge
 - Adopt backward design approaches
 - Provide supplemental material and **flip the classroom**
